L. Daniel Latt, MD, PhD has joined **University Physicians Healthcare** and the faculty of the **University of Arizona Department of Orthopaedic Surgery** as an assistant professor of clinical orthopaedic surgery.

Dr. Latt earned his medical degree from the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine in 2002. He completed residency trained in orthopaedic surgery at McGill University in Montreal, Canada in 2007. He has fellowship trained in both sports medicine, (Kaiser San Diego), and foot and ankle surgery (Duke University).

Dr. Latt specializes in the care of athletic injuries of the shoulder, knee, ankle and foot. He is particularly interested in complex lower extremity reconstruction and realignment, cartilage injuries, patellofemoral disorders and arthroscopy of the ankle, knee and shoulder. He has a special interest in the treatment of ankle arthritis using total ankle replacement.

Dr. Latt sees patients at the Arizona Institute for Sports Medicine (AZISM) on the UPH Hospital campus, 2800 E. Ajo Way and at UMC's Human Motion Institute (HMI) just north of 5th Street at 707 N. Alvernon Way.

In addition to his medical degree, Dr. Latt has a PhD in Bioengineering. He has experience in both human movement analysis and joint biomechanics. His current research interests include the study of the dynamic alignment of the lower extremity as it relates to knee and hindfoot disease and to functional outcomes following lower extremity reconstruction.
